IMPORTANT REMINDER - Tax Collection

Tax payments can be made in person at the **Brown County Treasurer's Office** located at 305 East Walnut Street, Room 160, Green Bay: Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Payments can be made online at www.co.brown.wi.us or in person at the following financial institutions: All **Pioneer Credit Union** locations located in Brown County or at **Denmark State Bank** located at **103 E. Main Street**, Denmark, Wisconsin.

Please note: Dog license fees cannot be included in your tax payment as in years past – please direct payments to Dawn Chervenka, Treasurer at 5856 Langes Corners Road, Denmark. An application can be requested from the Treasurer and/or is available online at the Town website under the Form section.

2013 Tax Roll: Residents will again see a decrease in the *Town's* apportionment of the 2013 tax roll. The mill rate for 2013 will be 3.086 in comparison to 3.149 in 2012. Collectively, the mill rate dropped to 16.475 from 17.470 (2012).

2014 Garbage/Recycling Schedule

Enclosed is the 2014 Garbage/Recycling Schedule from Advanced Disposal Services. Residents will see a charge of \$121.88 reflected on their tax bill in 2013 for garbage and recycling. The yearly garbage fee is included on your tax bill whether or not you use the service. Larger size carts are available to residents for an additional monthly fee. Carts can be upgraded to a 65 gallon cart for \$2.00 a month or 95 gallons for \$3.00 a month. Advance will direct bill residents for this upgrade. Please contact the Town Clerk if you are interested in an upgrade. Should you need to contact Advanced Disposal for other services, they can be reached at 1-800-279-1930. 2014 Pickup schedules are also available online at the Town website.

Due to inclement weather, garbage pick-up may occasionally be delayed. Should this occur, please check the Town website (www.townofnewdenmark.com) or residents who receive electronic mailing from the Town will automatically receive notice of these last minute changes.

Dog Licenses: Dog Licenses must be purchased separately from the Treasurer and cannot be included in your tax payment. Pursuant to Wisconsin statutes, all dogs over 5 months of age must be licensed. Fees for SPAYED OR NEUTERED DOGS are **\$10.00** otherwise, the license will be **\$15.00**. You will need to furnish the dog's name, sex, breed, whether it is spayed or neutered and the date of last **Rabies Vaccination** when applying for a license. Which Electronics **Are Banned** From Wisconsin Landfills?



Wisconsin's electronics recycling law bans landfilling and incineration of several electronics. These bans apply no matter where the devices are from or who used them. Wisconsin households, K-12 public schools and Parental Choice Program schools can recycle banned devices (except cell phones) through E-Cycle Wisconsin.



- Televisions
- Desktop printers, including printers combined with fax machines, scanners and copiers
- Computers, including desktops, laptops, netbooks and tablets
- Computer monitors
- E-readers
- Computer accessories including keyboards, mice, hard drives, scanners, speakers and flash drives
- Fax machines
- DVD players, VCRs, DVRs and other video players
- Cell phones

What Can I Recycle?

Wisconsin households, K-12 public schools and Parental Choice Program schools can recycle the following electronics under E-Cycle Wisconsin:

- ❑ Computers (desktop, laptop, netbook and tablet computers)
 - ❑ Desktop printers (including those that scan, fax and/or copy)
 - ❑ Computer monitors
 - ❑ E-readers
 - ❑ Televisions
 - ❑ DVD players, VCRs and DVRs
 - ❑ Fax machines
 - ❑ Mice and keyboards
 - ❑ Other computer accessories including hard drives, speakers, flash drives and modems
- These items, along with cell phones, are banned from Wisconsin landfills and incinerators.

To recycle electronics not included in the list above, talk with your electronics recycler or call your local recycling program to see if there are other options in your area.

Where Can I Recycle My Electronics?

Households, public schools and Parental Choice Program schools may recycle electronics at locations across the state. For a full list of collection sites, visit:

Some collectors may charge fees and may not accept all devices. Contact collectors beforehand to learn about their policies.

What Happens to My Electronics?

Electronics recyclers registered with E-Cycle Wisconsin must comply with state and federal disposal regulations that ensure environmental safety. Recyclers will break down your electronics, reuse or recycle safe materials, and properly manage hazardous chemicals or wastes.

What About Data Security?

Before recycling your computer, it is important that you remove all personal or confidential information. Many retailers offer this service for a small fee, or you can do it yourself. Before choosing a collector or recycler, ask them how they handle data security. Some may not accept hard drives.

Why E-Cycle?

- ❑ Electronics are the fastest-growing part of our waste stream today. Millions of TVs, computers and other household electronics become obsolete each year.
- ❑ Many electronics contain valuable, reusable materials like gold, steel, silver, copper and glass. Recycling old devices reduces the need for new materials and cuts down on greenhouse gas emissions associated with manufacturing.
- ❑ Recycling electronics protects human and environmental health. Electronics that are landfilled, incinerated or illegally dumped can release toxic materials like mercury, lead and cadmium into the air, water and soil. Recycling electronics helps ensure that these materials are reused safely or disposed of properly.
- ❑ E-cycling is an important part of product stewardship. By recycling our old electronics, we share responsibility for the products we buy and use from the beginning to the end of their useful lives.
